**7 - Kauri Trees**  
A spectacular grove of large Kauri trees located in the Waiau Falls Scenic Reserve. The Kauri trees are some of the largest in New Zealand.

**6 - Waiau Falls**  
Waiau Falls is the waterfall that cascades over a rock wall to the pool below. Located in the Waiau Falls Scenic Reserve the waterfall cascades over a rock wall to the pool below.

**5 - Castle Rock**  
Just past the waterfall is the road that leads up to Castle Rock. It is a bit of a scramble for the last few metres, but it is well worth the effort of any Northerner. From the last few metres, the waterfall point, drive up the forest road about 2km and then walk back down to the pool.

**4 - Wet Your Whistle Cafe**  
Local coffee and delicious snacks. Cafe open to the public 7 days from 9am-6pm. Cafe at The Waterworks. The perfect pit stop! Enjoy freshly ground coffee between 2 and 3 hours here if you wish to experience everything Waterworks has to offer.

**3 - The Waterworks**

**2 - Stuart & The Wild Pigs**  
Famous throughout the region, Stuart lives up the 309 Road. This place is home to 100+ wild pigs. Peacock's and an assortment of other animals. In the 1980's there was a quarry and also a school house on this land. Take some food with you to feed the pigs and don't forget your camera.

**1 - Coromandel Mussel Kitchen**  
Located on the corner of the 309 Road and Shizzi, the Coromandel Mussel Kitchen is unique in that they cultivate, harvest, cook and serve green mussels. Mostly unsealed, it showcases spectacular scenery as it winds through farmland, pine forests and extensive areas of beautiful native bush.

A leisurely drive along The 309 Road as part of your trip through the Coromandel Region will give you a feel for the real New Zealand countryside and inspire you through its undeniable beauty.

**Why are we different?**

We are a clean and tidy bunch at The Waterworks and like to look after the land we work in. With over 70% of the materials used in the construction of our attractions being recycled. Our cafe uses local suppliers and organic produce. Our food is never wasted... Petunia the pig makes sure of that!

- 100% of the wood used comes from sustainable forest 35km away in Colville.
- 100% of the water used to power the attractions is gravity fed from the creek. No electricity is used in the park's gardens.
- 100% of our water is heated by solar power.
- 100% of our wastewater is filtered and recycled and used in our vegetable garden.
